Dear Hoffman Families,

We recently revised the "Playground" section of our Student Expectations Packet, and I am happy to share the new expectations with you:

PLAYGROUND EXPECTATIONS

Be Respectful

- Listen carefully at all times to all adults on duty.
- By word and action show respect to all other students and adults.

Be Responsible


- Line up quickly and quietly when recess is over. I should stay in my line, facing forward, with nothing in my hands. When I hear the whistle, my voice should be at Level 0 so I can hear the adults on duty.
- Wear appropriate clothes for the weather and keep my indoor clothes and shoes dry. This means wear boots and gloves to play in the snow, and wear snow pants to kneel or sit in the snow.

Be Safe

- Share the playground equipment and to use it as intended (Examples: No running up the slide, no climbing on top of the monkey bars). Keep tag games away from the play equipment.
- Play safely without grabbing, play fighting, or putting myself or others in danger. Use PE rules for team sports.
- Remain within the boundaries of the playground.
- Ask an adult to go inside for the restroom or nurse, and report back to the adult when I return to the playground.
- Use snow only for building not for tunnels, eating, climbing, kicking, or throwing.
- Stay away from ice and icicles.

Please take a moment to review these with your child to help ensure a safe and fun recess for all!
